While the Emancipation
Proclamation was signed in 1863,
not everyone was freed until 1865
when some 2,000 Union troops
arrived in Galveston Bay, Texas. The
army announced that the more than
250,000 enslaved black people in
the state, were free by executive
decree. This day came to be known
as "Juneteenth," by the newly freed
people in Texas.

The first Juneteenth celebration took place in 1866 in Texas with community gatherings, including sporting events, cookouts, prayers, dances, parades, and the singing of spirituals like

"Many Thousands Gone" and "Go Down Moses." Some events even featured fireworks, which involved filling trees with gunpowder and setting them on fire.

At the core of the celebrations was a desire to record group gains since emancipation, "an occasion for gathering lost family members, measuring progress against freedom and inculcating rising generations with the values of self-improvement and racial uplift," Gates wrote.
